Enhancements and Fixed Issues

There have been numerous enhancements and fixes applied to **JBoss ESB 4.6.**, with many coming as a consequence of the ongoing productisation of the JBoss ESB 4.4 codebase within the SOA platform.

The most significant changes are the inclusion of support for JBoss AS 5.1.0.GA, updating to Smooks 1.2.1, JBoss Rules 5.0.1, jBPM 3.2.5 SP5 and the inclusion of alternative jBPM message and scheduler services. The release notes for this release can be found online at [JBoss ESB 4.6.](#)
